






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ISSICON 2025 Conference





Over 30 stalls featured traditional South Indian delicacies, international cuisines, and healthy snack options. Students from our vocational training programmes demonstrated their culinary skills, with many dishes prepared independently by persons with visual and hearing impairments.

Proceeds from the festival supported our scholarship programmes, demonstrating how inclusive events can generate both social impact and financial sustainability.

This initiative brought holistic healthcare, spiritual counselling, and well... services directly to rural communities, particularly benefiting persons with disabilities and marginalised families.

Free medical check-ups, vision and hearing tests, and distribution of assistive devices to those in need.

Wellness Sessions
Yoga, meditation, and stress management workshops promoting mental health and emotional well-being.

Counselling Services
Individual counselling and group therapy sessions addressing psychological challenges and trauma.

Over 400 rural residents benefited from the camp, with many receiving medical consultations and prescriptions free of charge. The collaboration demonstrates the power of partnerships in extending quality services to underserved communities.

World Mental Health Day Rally

On **World Mental Health Day**, Amar Seva Sangam organised an awareness rally in **Sengottai** to promote mental health awareness and break the stigma surrounding mental health challenges, particularly amongst persons with disabilities and rural communities.


