Shishu Sarothi will be using the Enabling Inclusion EI® app in their Centre-based programs in Kamrup Metro (at Sishu Sarothi campus and Composite Regional Centre for Persons with Disabilities), Goalpara (at Shishu Bikash Kendra), Golaghat (at District Early Intervention Centre and pediatric ICU in the Civil Hospital) and Dibrugarh (at Assam Medical College), to enroll up to 500 children in their pediatric rehab program.



Rehab Orchard

Amar Seva Sangam believes in creating a sustainable environment and as part of this goal, we are looking to create an Orchard with 100 different varieties of fruits saplings and 500 saplings of Amla.

This fruit garden will be one of kind and can be termed as a social garden. There are many benefits other than the yield from the garden. It can be recreation space for our inmates, staff, well-wishers, donors as well as society. The reason behind developing this concept is that this particular belt of Tamilnadu is surrounded by lot of mango and coconut grooves which can serve as a great picnic spot. We can also utilize this area for outdoor rehab training purpose and for our internal meetings also. All People who are nature lovers can come with their family and enjoy their time with nature for a day. This garden will be one of a kind and will be gift to our entire future generation with small contribution of each of us. From 3rd year onwards we can generate small income from the yield which will be used for our charity purposes apart from consumption for our inmates. This may provide indirect contribution to the nature and Sangam too.

We have earmarked for 6 acres of land which have fertile soil for this purpose. We have big farm well and water tank aside. By drip irrigation water requirement will be satisfied with least labour maintenance. For 6 acres of land area drip irrigation cost is nearly 1.50 lakhs (Rs: 150,000/-). We invite possible help from all blessed self for this need. A small drop of water may create ocean. Your little help in this regard not only make our dream come true drawing inspiration from kalamji " you have to dream before your dreams come true"








Monthwise Funds Received 2021-2022




Receipt Wise 2021-22







1. Management of ASSA Activities during Covid pandemic 1st and 2nd wave:

- Since last General Body, Amar Seva Sangam has been passing through a period of challenges and opportunities. The Covid pandemic was a biggest challenge and the second wave hit the country very badly in terms of the health emergency and Amar Seva Sangam in terms of its income generation and flow of contributions.
- The Sangam could not shut down as it did last year for the reasons of providing reasonable livelihood for the people working in Amar Seva Sangam and also for continuing at least partially through tele-rehabilitation and other online means; the education and rehabilitation support for the children under various programs.
- The organization's activity level never went down below 70% and it was lowest in the month of June 2021, but picked up and as on end August we are about 90% of the regular operational level. In the process, Amar Seva Sangam lost opportunities on manufacturing garments for the Tiruppur export requirements and also on the various productions which could have given some supporting revenues. The contributions from the general public also have come down drastically and the challenges to overcome them are to be faced, so that the year ending March 2023 ends with a positive financial result.

2. Enabling Inclusion – Centre of Excellence:

a) Partnering with Govt. and NGOs:

The opportunities that we had were very exciting as we were able to get the Government partnership on the key area of district Early Intervention and also the progress towards getting the Early Intervention at the State level being made a big headway with the help of Amar Seva Sangam's aggressive lobbying which has resulted in the Government announcing a substantial portion of their World Bank supported project towards Early Intervention for the coming years. Amar Seva Sangam hopes that this opportunity that has opened up would result in our organization getting the direct implementation partnership with the Government in various other districts also in addition to the four current districts in which we are operating with the Government of Tamil Nadu.

b) Partnership in India

We have also entered into partnership with four NGOs in different States in India including Uttar Pradesh, west Bengal and Assam where we have started scaling up through them our Early Intervention model.

c) Worldwide partnership:

The negotiation with the World Bank in Ethiopia is in a very advanced stage and would start implementing in another couple of months. Other World Vision supported negotiations in Albania and in the state of Andhra Pradesh are in advanced stages of getting finalized.

3. Program for School Going Children (Above 6):

The school going children model is also getting good support from the Government of Tamil Nadu in its Samagra Shiksha Abhiyan program. Amar Seva Sangam hopes be a full-fledged knowledge partner with them to help them develop a separate application similar to our Enabling Inclusion which can be used by Amar Seva Sangam also for our other partnership or scale-up purposes. This way Amar Seva Sangam's brand and image will get a substantial boost and the Centre of Excellence will start moving with the right acceleration in a progressive manner.

4. Discussion with NHM – Muscular Dystrophy:

The discussions with the National Health Mission regarding the scale up in other parts are also going on even though at a slower pace. The progress on the support systems for Muscular Dystrophy persons in the state of Tamil Nadu has also made some progress, a meeting being held with the Health Secretary and other Dept. officials to improve the service delivery and provide environment to create opportunities for persons with Muscular Dystrophy.

5. Placement and job creation for PwDs.

The expert committee on placement and job creation requested us to provide a list of employable avenues for persons with disabilities which was done when the new Secretary took over a couple of months back. This hopefully will expand the scope of existing job postings created for persons with disabilities in the State of Tamil Nadu.

6. Update about completion of infrastructures:

This year also we completed some of the key infrastructure development projects like the Compound Wall contributed by the Hon'ble Governor of Tamil Nadu (now Governor of Punjab) and the toilet project for the residential care children.

We have also successfully utilized the solar energy which has mitigated the electricity cost by more than 40%.

PAC Renovation:

The renovation for the Post-Acute Care Centre is also complete with the terrace being laid with tiles and improvements in their toilets.

7. Formation of new social enterprise - ASGA

We have established a separate social enterprise Amar Seva Global Association which is looking into the development of partnerships with NGOs and providing support to them with the help of the Enabling Inclusion App.

8. Fundraising:

The efforts to establish a fundraising mechanism is also taking shape with a consultant being hired to provide us standard operating systems and standardize the audio visual and stationary for the organization including the presentations for the donors and a mechanism for promotion through social media.

Outlook for the year 2021-22

Outlook for the year 2021-22 as mentioned is challenging and exciting as well.

Outlook for the year 2021-22

We need to spend the unspent money under the Income Tax Act to the tune of more than INR 2 Crores which is earmarked for spending on infrastructure development for the organization. The compound wall, check dam and building for Centre of Excellence in rehabilitation and development of the Children with Disabilities in the upstairs of the existing Admin Block are some of the planned projects out of this amount.

The training hall for the various initiatives towards our own workers and other NGOs and Govt. staff and also the parents and other stakeholders is under construction with the support of Sanmina Group of Companies under CSR, from Chennai.

The extension of the 23 blocks with the support from the Tamil Nadu Govt. till 2023 is also on the anvil. The partnership with the Samagra Shiksha Abhiyan with Education Department of Tamil Nadu Govt. in implementing the inclusive education strategies through our own Enabling Inclusion technology in a modified form is also under way.

Outlook for the year 2021-22

Amar Seva Sangam's 40th year Anniversary celebrations have to be performed in a big way during 2022, in the cities like Mumbai, Bengaluru, Chennai for which the President of India, Prime Minister, Chief Ministers and Governors of the concerned States and Tamil Nadu will be invited as Chief Guests.

The sustainable fundraising and revenue generation for the organization will be the topmost priority in the coming year in formulating the system and structure for the same.

Pitching Amar Seva Sangam's reach to other States in a partnership approach will be the key area of focus that will be pursued.

Rehab Orchard, a revolutionary concept is being initiated, which is bound to give new niches for Amar Seva Sangam in the coming years for the Early Childhood Development and Rehabilitation.

Strategic purchase of land for future purposes of the organization are also on the cards.
