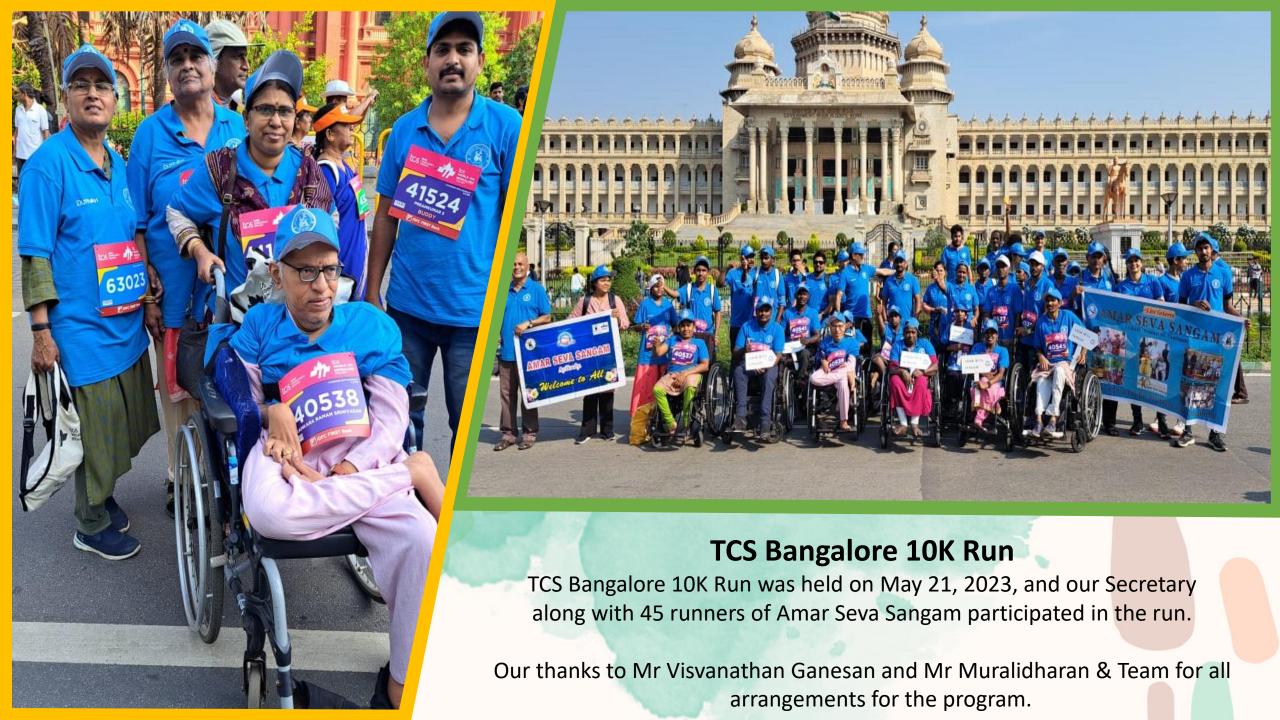

- 9. Mobilising resources for rehabilitating PWDs;
- Role of DPOs and the way out in boosting their effectiveness in serving PWDs.

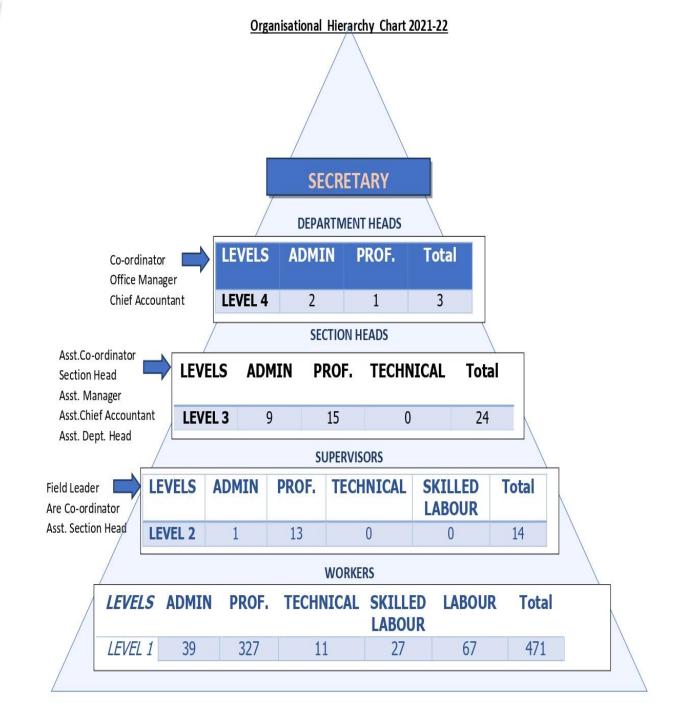
